New ESGENA Logo

In February 2005 the ESGENA Governing Board made the final decision on the new logo-a stylised eye.

The eyebrow can be interpreted as an umbrella, uniting the individual European countries. The ESGENA Governing Board hopes that the new logo will find broad acceptance and identification. ESGENA Website

ESGENA Education Grants

ESGENA European Education Grants are offered to fully trained European nurses who wish to undertake further clinical training in specialised endoscopic or gastroenterological nursing at an officially recognised ESGENA host centre. Hands-on training may not be possible in many countries due to legal restrictions.

ESGENA Grants are restricted to ESGENA Members (either with Individual Membership or with Group Membership through their national Group). Each grant covers a maximum period of 4 weeks. Successful applicants will be asked to report back concerning the quality of their training period. Please note that a high proficiency in the language of the preferred host country is essential and the candidate should be able to provide a report after the visit in *English*. Experience has shown that most nurses are able to travel with a standard holiday visa, which should be organised by the applicant prior to departure. Selection will be made by the ESGENA Board. Applications for 2005 and 2006 should be send to Christiane Neumann (Christiane.Neumann@swbh.nhs.uk).
